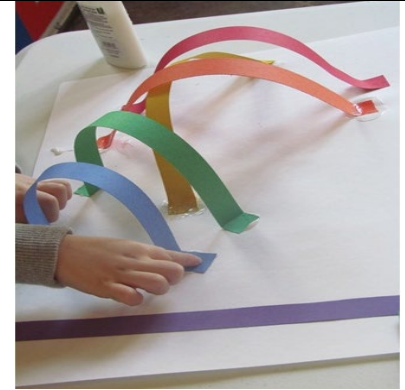


Title: 3D Paper Rainbows Craft

Age Group: Toddler / Preschool

Type of Activity: Physical Fine Motor

Materials:

- Different colours of Construction paper
- One white sheet of paper
- Glue, child-safe scissors, ruler, etc.

How to Do it:

- Cut all construction paper into strips, having your child use child-safe scissors
- Provide your child with a visual of a rainbow and identify the colours
- Help them sort through all the colours until they have one of each colour in a rainbow.
- Have your child choose a full-size sheet for their base and spread the paper strips out on their paper in order to create a rainbow
- Add glue to each end of the paper strip then press and hold your fingers on both ends of the paper, making an arch, for 10 seconds.

Root Skill / Extension:

Physical, Fine motor 5.2 Tool use - cutting with child safe scissors.

Cognition 4.3 Representation – Drawing and constructing 2D and 3D models

Extend the learning: Do some alternate activities for building fine motor skills like stringing large beads, or providing varied-textured paper like poster sheets, tissue paper, newsprint or cardboard of different colours, sizes, and shapes
