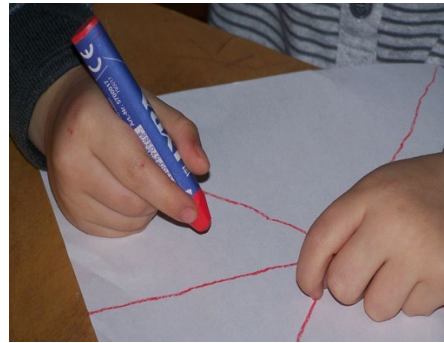
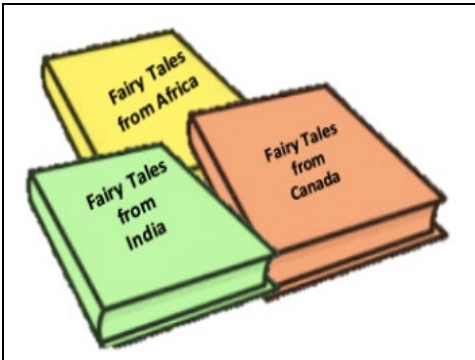


Title: Homemade Fairy Tale Picture Book

Type of Activity: Illustration

Materials:

- Crayons
- White paper
- Construction paper
- Stapler
- Printed fairy tales (from various cultures)

How to Do it:

- Read a fairy tale to your child without pictures
- Ask your child to draw a picture about the story
- Help your child glue the fairy tale to the back of their drawing
- Repeat this process for several other diverse fairy tales
- When you have enough pictures staple them all together into a book
- Use the construction paper for the book cover

Fairy tales present real-life challenges in an age-appropriate manner to help small children grasp complex morals. Allowing them to recreate the story through pictures, builds their imagination and helps them articulate their feelings / ideas.
