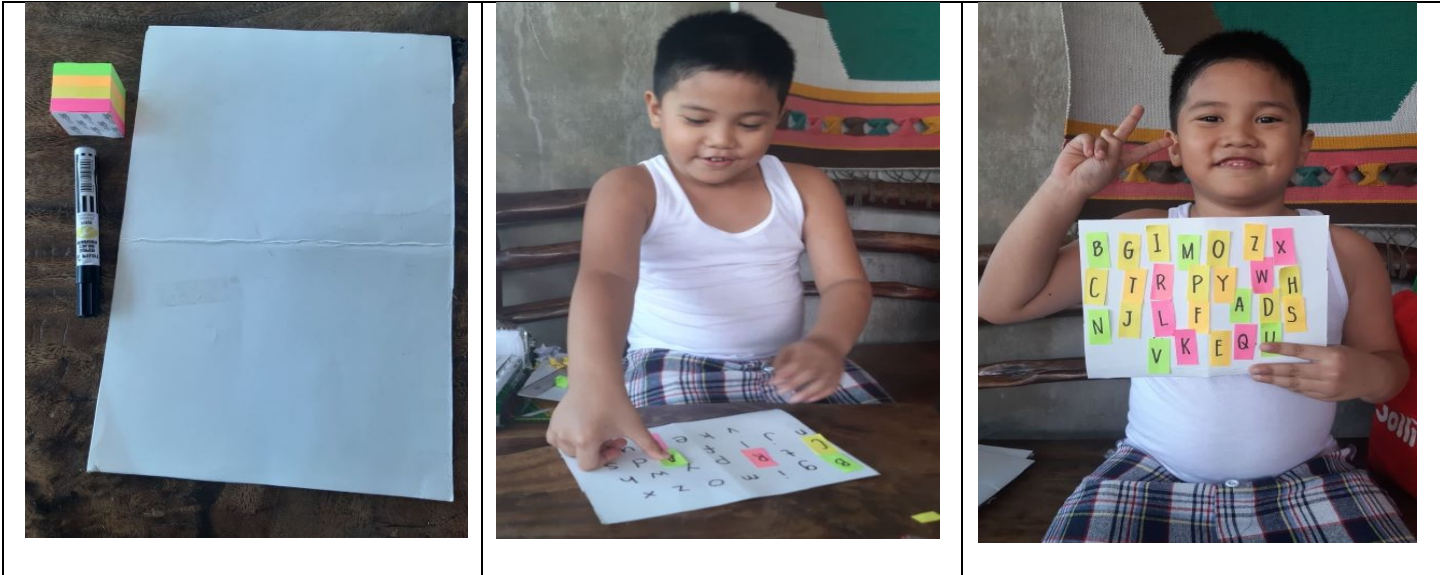


Title: Upper and Lowercase Matching Letters

Age Group: Kindergarten / School Age

Type of Activity: Literacy

Materials:

- Construction Paper/ Printing Paper
- Different colours of small post-it notes (printing paper can be used too)
- Marker

How to Do it:

- On a piece of construction paper/printing paper, write the **lowercase** alphabet in a random order.
- Write one **uppercase** letter on each post-it note until you complete the whole alphabet.
- Ask your child to match the uppercase alphabet to the lowercase by sticking the right post-it note to the paper.

Root Skill / Extension:

This activity helps children recognize the difference between uppercase and lowercase letters. The beauty of this activity is that it can be repeated by making a different arrangement of letters on a new piece of construction paper.

To extend the learning, you can ask your child to spell their name with the letter post-it notes and start practicing writing their letters by over tracing it.
